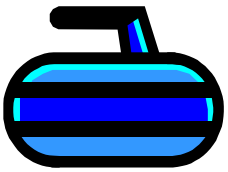

Stuart Parrott Wins Volunteer-of-the-Year Award in National Competition

The Canadian Curling Association (CCA) established, for the 1999/2000 curling year, a volunteer-of-the-year award.

Application forms were sent to curling clubs throughout Canada for each to nominate a worthy candidate. The BCC did just that and nominated Stuart Parrott. The nomination required a 500-word essay describing what Stuart did and the measurable benefits that resulted from his volunteer work. Following are some highlights of the essay:

1. Secretary of BCC.
2. Wrote a successful grant application to the Manitoba Community Services Council receiving \$6,000 towards for converting an open-loop compressor water-cooling system to a closed-loop glycol system.
3. Registration chairman.
4. Ran the Grey Cup fundraiser.

5. Made all the sponsorship ice decals.
6. Draw master for both Tuesday and Thursday Men's leagues.
7. Made winners certificates for both men's and ladies leagues for club wind-up presentation.
8. Started a monthly newsletter producing a total of 5 newsletters over the last season.
9. Attended Phase 1 of the **Business of Curling** seminar in Portage La Prairie sponsored by the CCA.
10. Wrote a successful \$1800 grant application to the CCA for promoting curling in Eastman and the BCC.
11. Produced a web page to promote the BCC. The page is also linked to the Manitoba Curling Association web site.

Stuart is extremely well organized and detailed in every project that he takes on. He was recently

complimented by the CCA for his closing report of a grant application. Comment was: **'Thank you for the terrific report. If every application was as thorough and well prepared as yours, my job would be simple indeed'.**



Stuart won an all expense paid trip for two to the Brier, including \$200 spending money. He will also be showcased at one of the final games of the Brier. Watch for him on CBC-TV and give him a big pat on the back the next time you see him.
